Safeguarding at Our School

The safety and wellbeing of every child is our top priority. All staff at our schools play an active role in safeguarding and are committed to creating a safe, supportive environment where children can thrive.

Every year, all staff take part in statutory safeguarding training provided through the Lincolnshire Safeguarding Children Partnership (LSCP). This ensures that everyone is up to date with the latest guidance and procedures. Training covers important topics such as:

- Recognising signs of abuse or neglect
- Online safety and managing digital risks
- Domestic abuse awareness – recognising how domestic situations may affect a child's wellbeing or behaviour in school.
- Mental health and emotional wellbeing – understanding the link between mental health and safeguarding concerns.

We want parents and carers to know that safeguarding is everyone's responsibility. If you ever have a concern about a child's safety or wellbeing, please speak to a member of the Designated Safeguarding Team or contact the school office for advice. Together, we can make sure all our pupils feel safe, supported, and valued. We have a dedicated area for safeguarding on our website.

Reminder – 48-Hour Rule After Sickness or Diarrhoea

To help prevent the spread of infection, please remember that children must stay at home for at least 48 hours after their last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea. This means your child should only return to school 48 hours after they were last unwell, even if they seem better. This guidance follows Public Health England (now UKHSA) advice and helps protect other pupils and staff from becoming ill. Thank you for your support in keeping our school community healthy!

Eye tests

Being able to see clearly is incredibly important in your child's development and learning in school. If you notice any of these signs, it might be worth getting an eye test booked in for them:

- Straining their eyes or tilting their head to see better
 - Frequent eye rubbing
 - Losing their place while reading or using a finger to guide their eyes
 - Complaining of headaches or tired eyes
 - Consistently sitting too close to the TV or holding a book too close
 - Closing one eye to read, watch TV or see better
 - Avoiding using a computer or tablet because it hurts their eyes
